# SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT GOALS

## 17 GOALS TO TRANSFORM OUR WORLD

### 1 NO POVERTY



Co-created by local leaders and our locally hired employees, the economic and social development programs designed to alleviate poverty and impact over 100,000 community members.

### 2 ZERO HUNGER



Our organic greenhouse distributes seedlings to the community for reforestation and community gardens. Carbon revenue also funds water access and sustainable farming training.

### 3 GOOD HEALTH AND WELL-BEING



Regional hospital labs have been renovated and equipped with updated technology. The project increases resources for community educators and NGOs to conduct health workshops including menstrual hygiene and sex education.

### 4 QUALITY EDUCATION



As of 2022, over 26,000 students have received scholarships totaling over \$1.2 million dollars.

### 5 GENDER EQUALITY



30% of our workforce is female, many of whom are managers and rangers, roles typically reserved for men in the region. We conduct company-wide anti-harassment training and have a strong equity and diversity policy.

### 6 CLEAN WATER AND SANITATION




Carbon revenues have funded the completion of over 50 water projects that improve access to clean water for over 100,000 people.

### 7 AFFORDABLE AND CLEAN ENERGY



Our sustainable charcoal team has produced tens of thousands of kgs of eco-charcoal without cutting down a single tree and are developing sales channels to increase its distribution. Eight permanent staff manually process 850-1,274 0.5kg briquettes/week.



**8** DECENT WORK AND ECONOMIC GROWTH

We have 300+ locally hired employees, making us the 2nd largest job provider in the county.



**9** INDUSTRY, INNOVATION AND INFRASTRUCTURE

A classroom was converted into a computer lab to provide internet access to rural students. Road improvements were funded in the project area and support micro loan programs.



**10** REDUCED INEQUALITIES

Wildlife Works REDD+ projects in developing nations provide funding for sustainable livelihoods and development programs to give agency to marginalized forest communities.



**12** RESPONSIBLE CONSUMPTION AND PRODUCTION

The Wildlife Works eco factory trains and employs over 70 local community members to produce apparel and accessories for sustainable brands worldwide.




**13** CLIMATE ACTION

The Kasigau REDD+ project reduces 1.7 million tons of carbon dioxide emissions annually.



**15** LIFE ON LAND

The Kasigau REDD+ project protects over 200,000 hectares of dryland forest, thousands of threatened elephants and 3 IUCN endangered species.



**16** PEACE, JUSTICE AND STRONG INSTITUTIONS

Wildlife Works co-creates projects with land owners and forest communities within the existing culture to implement inclusive self-governance structures. We operate with full transparency and zero tolerance for corruption.



**17** PARTNERSHIPS FOR THE GOALS

Wildlife Works projects are examples of private-public-community partnerships that bring together national and regional government, local community and private sector to bring in conservation finance and community development.
